SURGICAL OUTCOMES

- INSERTION OF A BLADDER CATHETER
- BLEEDING REQUIRING RETURN TO THEATRE
- WOUND INFECTION/HERNIA REQUIRING FURTHER
- TREATMENT
- LYMPHOCELE REQUIRING RADIOLOGICAL OR SURGICAL INTERVENTION
- URETERIC STRICTURE REQUIRING RADIOLOGICAL OR SURGICAL INTERVENTION OR PERMANENT STENT INSERTION.
- URINARY LEAK REQUIRING PROLONGED BLADDER
- CATHETERISATION AND/OR RADIOLOGICAL OR SURGICAL INTERVENTION
- INSERTION OF STENT WITH FURTHER PROCEDURE TO REMOVE IT

TRANSPLANT COMPLICATIONS

- FAILURE FOR KIDNEY TO WORK REQUIRING CONTINUED DIALYSIS AND/OR LATER REMOVAL OF KIDNEY
- DELAYED FUNCTION OF NEW KIDNEY REQUIRING
- PROLONGED DIALYSIS
- KIDNEY THROMBOSIS OR RUPTURE REQUIRING SURGICAL
- ACUTE AND CHRONIC REJECTION REQUIRING RENAL
- BIOPSY (OPEN OR CLOSED) AND FURTHER
 IMMUNOSUPPRESSION TREATMENT WITH POSSIBLE LOSS
 OF KIDNEY

IMMUNOSUPPRESSION RELATED COMPLICATIONS

- LONG TERM IMMUNOSUPPRESSION DRUGS REQUIRED
- SIDE EFFECTS OF DRUGS INCLUDE: TREMOR, LIVER PROBLEMS, RENAL PROBLEMS, HIRSUITISM, GUM ENLARGEMENT, HIGH CHOLESTEROL, STOMACH ULCERATION, BONE MARROW SUPPRESSION, DIABETES, OSTEOPOROSIS, POOR WOUND HEALING, CATARACTS, ALOPECIA, WT GAIN, HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE LONG TERM IMMUNOSUPPRESSION IS ASSOCIATED WITH

GENERAL COMPLICATIONS

- URINARY INFECTION REQUIRING ANTIBIOTIC TREATMENT
- RECURRENCE OF ORIGINAL DISEASE IN NEW KIDNEY
- A TRANSPLANT DOES NOT CURE THE ORIGINAL DISEASE AND
- THEY MAY NOT WORK FOR EVER
